Greetings everyone,

At the end of this term all students in years 1-7 will receive a comprehensive student report which outlines their progress in relation to National Curriculum requirements. Students in reception receive a modified report in the first semester (two terms) and then a full report at the end of the year. As a school we feel that the modified report for a child's first six months of school presents a more realistic level of achievement as many students are just beginning to read, write and work with numbers.

Before the reports are sent home; classroom teachers will be getting around to as many students as they can to explain to them why they are receiving the grades and comments and congratulating them or providing them with explicit information about how to improve. These grades will be based on a body of work that the students have produced over the last two terms at school. I encourage you to sit down with your child and talk through the report when it comes home at the end of term. Praise them for their efforts and attitude and talk to them constructively about how they can continue to do their best.'

As a school we continue to embrace the impact of technology on learning and from term 3, 2018 all classes, including: PE, Japanese and Science will be regularly sharing student work samples with parents via the seesaw app. Many classes have been doing this already; however for your convenience we have decided to implement it school wide next term. Seesaw is a digital portfolio of student work samples. These may include videos, photos, drawings, notes and voice recordings accessed directly from your mobile device. Parents love seesaw because it allows them to be closer to the classroom without being there everyday and students love it because they get to share their work with a meaningful audience. Teachers love it because it gives them another insight into how the students are progressing. You would have already received a special invite or code from your child's teacher/s so you can view all of your child's posted work. For privacy reasons you will only be able to view your own child's work and you will be able to like or comment on it. Go to <https://web.seesaw.me/parents/> for more information. You are not obliged to access seesaw or like or comment; however we are offering this as another digital form of communication between the school and home to keep you in tune and up to date with your child's learning. I hope that you and your family enjoy the benefits of Seesaw.

Finally, the staff are attending Professional Development tomorrow to try and improve the way that we teach maths to your students. As teachers we are 'life long learners' and are always looking to improve our practice. I want to thank the amazing staff here who always approach professional learning with an open heart and open mind.
